If you are some kind of beer-drinking superhero, you can continue your Oktoberfest bender Sunday, Sept. 20, at Rocktoberfest at Guy Hollerin's, aka the courtyard of the Holiday Inn, [3600 Plymouth Rd](#). Doors don't open until 1pm, so you have plenty of time to sleep off the night before. The beer tent is sponsored by Arbor Brewing, and the Bluescasters, Chef Chris and the Rumpshakers, and Jimmy McCarty and Mystery Train are putting the rock in Rocktoberfest. \$25 admission includes heapin' helpin' of German food; a portion of the proceeds benefits Food Gatherers.
