What: The Michigan Regional Council of Carpenters Detroit Carpenters Joint Apprenticeship Training Center offers career and skill advancement courses to ensure that the union construction industry maintains the highest skilled workforce available and produces motivated workers capable of completing projects in the safest, most efficient manner.

When: The school was formed in 1941 and has since been recognized among the finest training facilities in the country.

School Stats:

- 500 students attend the Apprenticeship school each year
- 416 journeymen attended upgrade classes in 2008
- 16 courses are offered
- The apprenticeship is a four-year, comprehensive program that incorporates classroom instruction, and on-the-job training.
