Heigl tells 'Ugly Truth' about 'Grey's'

Katherine Heigl, play nice? Not in this lifetime. The "Ugly Truth" star sat down with **David Letterman** on "The Late Show" on Monday and was barely able to mask her contempt for "Grey's Anatomy," the ABC hospital drama that gave her a career past appearing in [sexy](#) spreads in men's magazines. "Our first day back was Wednesday and it was -- I'm going to keep saying this because I hope it embarrasses them -- a 17-hour day," Heigl told Letterman, "which I think is cruel and mean." Heigl also lamented the loss of co-star **T.R. Knight**, who was written off the show; poked fun at her character's current coma storyline; and rolled her eyes at the prospect of being with the show for an extended period of time. Heigl's battles with the "Grey's" creators are no secret, and her movie career is on solid ground after the successes of "Knocked Up" and "27 Dresses." So, um, why doesn't she just leave?
